Key Vocabulary/ Formal Elements:

Graffiti	Words or drawings painted drawn or stencilled on public buildings.
Stencils	A thin sheet of card, plastic or metal with a shape or letters cut out of it, used to produce the cut design on the surface by the application of paint or ink through the holes.
Street Art	Artwork that is created in a public space, typically without permission.
Inspiration	A response to a work of art which stimulates you to create your own art work in a similar way.
Artist case study	A presentation of facts about a chosen artist, which should also include images of their work and your own opinion and Response to their work.
Banksy	World famous Graffiti artist who creates elaborate designs using stencils, often with a political, anti-establishment message.

Coloured pencil crayons, poster paint, marker pens, photocopies of Banksy's work, card, skateboard shapes,

WHAT IS A MOOD BOARD?

A mood board is a collection of images used by artists and designers to help them create a theme from their ideas and develop the style of their design.

HOW TO MAKE A MOOD BOARD:

Collect lots of images which relate to the theme of your design. These can be drawings, photos, colour swatches or images from magazines and the internet.

Place these images together on a sheet of paper or in your sketchbook, grouping images which go together in some way.

Images can be grouped by subject, colour, style or any category you choose..

Design stages:

- Study artist/ artistic style
- Collect images, copy images of chosen artist/ artistic style
- Develop your own designs, using your selected images as inspiration.
- Choose one of your designs and reproduce in full size/colour.
