Dear Parents and Carers

**Re: PSHE at The Dean Academy**

As a part of your child's education at The Dean Academy, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. Modelling and informing high standards of PSHE throughout the school is the responsibility of all staff, whether classroom teachers or teaching assistants and staff receive regular and detailed training around this subject each year.

PSHE education in the United Kingdom is compulsory and explores three main strands: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world. We ensure that PSHE education runs throughout all curriculum subject areas, as well as tutor time and assemblies, and gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

All students in Key Stage Three study Values and Society lessons once a week, where PSHE forms a large proportion of curriculum content alongside compulsory British Values and the study of religious, philosophical and ethical beliefs. Topics covered in Year 9 include The Problem of Evil; Is it Ever Right to Take a Life?; Do We Have a Duty to Look After the Environment?; Does Everyone Have the Right to Human Rights?; Safe Relationships and Sex Education.

I am writing to let you know that next year, in Term Five and Six (April - July 2020), your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) aspect of this programme. RSE lessons in Year 9 will include teaching about age appropriate healthy relationships, including consent, abusive relationships, Female Genital Mutilation and forced marriage; contraception; Sexually Transmitted Disease including HIV; sexuality; body image, dysmorphia and the influence of the online world on young people, including pornography. Students will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for dealing with friendships and relationships of all kinds in the modern world.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. Please visit the school's website for more details about our Values and Society curriculum. All teaching takes place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.
