



Rights – something you are entitled to by law



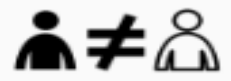
Responsibilities – something you ought to do, especially if it helps someone else have rights

Freedom – the ability to do something without restraint



Basic right – rights which underpin all humans' lives (eg, clean water, feeling safe, shelter)

Political rights – rights which exist to enable people to participate in the establishment of a government



Legal rights – rights which are founded upon law or accepted rules (eg, right to a fair trial)

Human rights – rights which are protected according to the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights since 1948



Prejudice – a thought or idea where you believe a person or a group of people are different, usually second class citizens, to yourself

Discrimination – acting on a prejudice idea to treat someone or a group of people differently, usually as a secondary citizen



UNICEF – the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund, a charitable organisation to help children around the world

Democracy – a political set up which gives each person eligible the right to vote for their government



Free speech – the right to express any opinions without censorship or restraint

Hate speech – abusive or threatening speech or writing that expresses prejudice

Hate crime – a crime, typically involving violence, that is motivated by prejudice on the basis or race, religion, sexual orientation or other grounds
