
Yesterday, we released our provisional plans for students in Year 10. Our number one priority is to maintain safety for all our community and our plans are based on the continuation of online learning. We are developing our use of technology and some faculties are now trialling adding video clips of themselves into presentations with more direct instructions and explanations of tasks. As teachers we will be asking for students to upload work to us, this is to check understanding and for teachers to adapt what is being set. Our Year 10s will begin to have some face to face time with teachers during June, however we cannot be certain of the date as we are awaiting confirmation from the government, which will be released on the 28<sup>th</sup> May. After this date we will be sending out more information. We will then be in touch with our provisional plans.
