Undergraduate and postgraduate courses at Hartpury University

Hartpury University continues to offer degrees in its 5 main subject areas; agriculture, animal, equine, sport and veterinary nursing.

Our **equine** degrees include Equestrian Sports Science, Equine Behaviour and Welfare and Equestrian Sports Coaching. We also have several postgraduate courses including our new course, our MSc in Horse Rider Musculoskeletal Therapy and Rehabilitation.

In **agriculture** we offer 4 university routes. The BSc (Hons) in Agriculture, and then the 3 specialised degrees in Crop Production, Livestock Production and International.

In **animal**, we offer courses such as Zoology, Canine Training and Performance and Animal Behaviour and Welfare. Our range of postgraduate courses is also continually growing with options such as our MSc in Animal Welfare, Police and Legislation. Our **Veterinary Nursing** courses can also prepare students for a career in veterinary nursing.

Lastly, our **sport** department offers a wide range of courses preparing students for careers as professional athletes, coaches, nutritionists or teachers. Degrees include Sports Business Management, Sport and Exercise Sciences, Sports Therapy and Sports Coaching, to name a few.
