UCAS application deadline

The UCAS Application deadline for **all undergraduate courses with 2022 entry** (except those with a 15 October deadline, such as courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science, and dentistry) is **18:00 (UK time) on 26 January 2022**.

Universities and colleges do not have to consider applications received after the deadline, although they can if they have spaces available once the on-time applications have been considered (*Source: UCAS*). If you have not done so already, do ensure you complete your application over the Christmas holidays. This will include completing your personal details, educational history and your personal statement.

Some top tips for your Personal Statement:

1. Remember to tell your reader why you want to study the course you are interested in– they want to see your passion and enthusiasm for your subject.
2. Be you! Avoid using quotes from other people and talk about you and your experiences, your passion and your interests.
3. Think about the skills and achievements you have gained, what they have taught you and how they will help with your future studies.
