# MUSIC AWARDS EVENING



Year 9s have been busy cooking some colourful and tasty curry dishes as part of their assessment this week with Mrs Gittins-Jones.








# **ASDAN**

Year 11 Asdan students have been working on challenges regarding Cyberbullying and studies of wild animals found in Great Britain.








Archie T decided to find out as much information about Wild Boar as he could and included his own knowledge when he prepared a poster with drawings, information pictures.

Smiling I wave, not knowing what to do or to plea One of them, distraught, the other smiling with


