Female Genital Mutilation

I wanted to take the opportunity to inform you that this term your year 7 child will be looking at female genital mutilation (FGM) in one of their personal development lessons. Please note that this is a statutory requirement and is in place to ensure we safeguard children. It is essential that every young person, as a citizen in a diverse society, should learn about FGM. The lesson will explore:

- What FGM is and how it affects people
- The law on FGM
- How to manage the threat of FGM for themselves and others
- How to seek help and support if FGM has happened

In terms of FGM, prevention is key, and this is what the Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) element of our personal development curriculum aims to do. Our lessons aim to be effective in equipping young people with the skills that will help to keep them and others safe. There are critical timescales when it comes to FGM as it is more likely to be carried out before puberty, hence why we're addressing it in year 7.
